Use of Likeness: Digital Replicas

Summary:

Protects deceased people's digital replicas from unauthorized use and establishes a cause of action for damages. This bill helps keep control of how the images of deceased individuals are used, making sure their likeness is respected and not exploited.


Impact on SAG-AFTRA Performers:

- Protects the legacy and rights of deceased performers by safeguarding their digital replicas from unauthorized commercial exploitation.
- Allows for compensation and legal recourse for unauthorized use, ensuring that families and estates can seek damages and enforce rights.

Notes:

- LA Local President Jodi Long testified for this bill in Sacramento.
- SAG-AFTRA strongly supports this bill.

Contracts Against Public Policy: Personal or Professional Services: Digital Replicas

Summary:

Addresses contracts involving digital replicas, making provisions unenforceable if they lack clear consent and detailed use terms. It ensures that individuals are notified if existing contracts use their digital likenesses.

Impact on SAG-AFTRA Performers:

- Ensures performers control their digital likenesses, requiring clear terms and consent for use.
- Keeps exclusivity terms enforceable in contracts, even if digital likeness clauses are invalidated.

Notes:

- Defines digital replica as a "computer-generated, electronic representation
 of the voice or likeness of an individual that is readily identifiable as that
 individual and fixed in a sound recording or audiovisual work."
- SAG-AFTRA strongly supports this bill.

Generative AI Accountability Act


Summary:

Mandates state agencies to assess and report on the risks and management of AI technologies, emphasizing transparency and accountability in their use. It aims to ensure that AI communications are clearly marked and provide avenues for human interaction.

Impact on SAG-AFTRA Performers:

- Enhances protection against deceptive AI practices, such as deepfakes.
- Promotes transparency, ensuring performers know when and how their likenesses are used by Al systems.

Safe and Secure Innovation for Frontier Artificial Intelligence Models Act

Summary:

Establishes protocols for the safe development of AI, requiring regular reporting and accountability from developers. It aims to create a safe framework for AI innovation, preventing misuse.


Impact on SAG-AFTRA Performers:

- Introduces safeguards against the unethical use of performers' likenesses.
- Provides a structure for performers to have recourse if their images or voices are used without permission.

Notes:

- We call SB 1047 the "Anti-Armageddon" bill, because it aims to make the big Al companies (OpenAl, Anthropic, etc.) face transparency and accountability for the large models they create.
- Lots of resistance from the tech industry and US Congress via tech lobby

Crimes: Child Pornography


Summary:

Amends existing laws to include Al-generated imagery, addressing the use of artificial intelligence to create or distribute child pornography. The bill expands the legal definition to cover depictions of minors engaged in sexual conduct through Al or computer-generated means, thereby enhancing legal measures against such exploitation.

Impact on SAG-AFTRA Performers:

- Strengthens protections for minors in the entertainment industry from being exploited through new technologies.
- Supports broader industry standards and practices that safeguard ethical use of technology, indirectly benefiting all performers by promoting responsible content creation.

California Provenance, Authenticity and Watermarking Standards


Summary:

Requires Al-generated content to be watermarked and clearly labeled, making it easier to track and manage the use of digital content. In-device watermarking mandated on new cameras, microphones, etc.

Impact on SAG-AFTRA Performers:

- Can aid performers track the use of their likenesses and ensure authenticity.
- Helps prevent unauthorized and fraudulent use of a performer's digital identity.

Crimes: Distribution of Intimate Images


Summary:

Criminalizes the creation and distribution of Al-generated intimate images without consent, expanding protections under existing privacy laws.

Impact on SAG-AFTRA Performers:

 Provides legal protections against the unauthorized use of intimate images, offering recourse for performers whose images are exploited.

Generative Artificial Intelligence: Training Data Transparency

Summary:

Mandates transparency in the training data used for Al systems, requiring developers to disclose the sources and nature of the data used.


Impact on SAG-AFTRA Performers:

- Ensures performers have the right to know and consent to the use of their data in Al training sets.
- Promotes ethical Al development practices, with a focus on consent and transparency.

Notes:

 This bill could pave the way for a definition of informed consent that protects individuals from exploitation, in and out of show business.

S NO FAKES Act

Summary:

Strengthens protections for individuals' voice and visual likenesses against unauthorized digital manipulation, ensuring that their digital identities are safeguarded.

Impact on SAG-AFTRA Performers:

- Enhances the ability of performers to control and protect their digital likenesses from unauthorized use, ensuring their images and voices aren't exploited without proper compensation or consent.
- Supports the legal framework that recognizes and prosecutes the unauthorized use of a performer's digital identity, thereby safeguarding their personal and professional interests.

Notes:

- Strongly influenced by SAG-AFTRA legal staff.
- This bill defines a "digital replica" at the Federal level, naming it a property
 right like intellectual property
- Movement (PCAP) not in the legislation

Artificial Intelligence Technology

Summary:

Expands the definitions related to AI and synthetic voices and images, specifying that their misuse is considered false impersonation. This bill seeks to clarify the legal status of AI-generated content, aligning it with existing laws against impersonation and fraud.

Impact on SAG-AFTRA Performers:

- Helps protect performers from being misrepresented by Al-generated synthetic voices or images.
- Provides a framework for legal action if a performer's likeness is used without consent, ensuring accountability.
